Discussion Questions:

- 1. How are the Flinits characterized in the first paragraph? Why might Jacobs include these details?
- 2. Why does Linda decide she must leave her children?
- 3. Does Linda's description of her circumstances justify her decision?
- 4. How does Jacobs' description of the conflicts she faces build suspense?
- 5. Why might Jacobs have chosen to use pseudonyms for the characters/people in her story?
- 6. Record a couple examples of dialect that occur in this narrative.
- 7. In lines 68-70, Mr. Flint says that he will reunite Linda with her children if she returns. Do you think he is telling the truth? Explain your answer with evidence from the text.
- 8. We know that Linda sacrifices her life for her children. Who makes a sacrifice for Linda? What do these sacrifices suggest about slave families?
- 9. After reading lines 90-98, how do you feel about Linda? Does your perspective of her change throughout the narrative? Explain your answer.
- 10. What types of conflict does Jacobs illustrate throughout this narrative? Was any one more impactful on you than another? Explain your answer.
